1. Pledge of Allegiance and Safety Message

Safety Message: Patrick Hughes, Emergency Manager Fire Inspector presented and reviewed a handout on winter holiday safety and Christmas Tree safety.

2. Public Comment

Honorable Christine Hoferer advised the Board of Commissioner's that the proposed new Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) over-time regulation would not take effect December 1, 2016.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY Commissioner Black, seconded by Commissioner MacBeth and unanimously carried by the Board to approve and sign the contract award for the State Revolving Fund Grant for Preliminary Engineering Report for the Hawthorne Regional Water Plan, in the amount of \$63,000.

14. Cherrie George, Senior Services Program Director – For consideration and possible action relative to the 6th Street School; may include action relative to the following topics: environment, property acquisition, structural, renovations, funding issues and sources, collaboration with School District and other agencies.

Ms. George stated there was no new information to discuss. She was still waiting for a letter from the School Board. Ms. George also stated she was considering various options.

15. Honorable Paul Macbeth, Commissioner – For consideration and possible action relative to the Western Nevada Development District remaining invoice balance.

Washington Federal no longer needed to lease a parcel, the current location of the ATM was not sold as was expected.

Building Inspector Mike Fontaine gave the Board an update of property conditions for properties sold at auction in April 2016.

Four (4) properties purchased by James D. Lewis were discussed. Mr. Lewis is presumed deceased and there was no information to contact in of kin.

Eric Hamrey stated the old Movie Theater, now owned by James D. Lewis was on Brownsfields list.

The Clerk-Treasurers office was directed to send letters to non-conforming property owners stating the property had been inspected, the property was found to be in a non-conforming state, terms of the sale were not complied with, owners have forty-five (45) days to contact the building inspector Mike Fontaine to set up a plan for abatement, or Mineral County will pursue legal remedy.

A MOTION WAS MADE BY Commissioner Black, seconded by Commissioner MacBeth and unanimously carried by the Board to have the Clerk-Treasurers office to send certified return receipt letters to property owners who have not conformed to the conditions of the trust sale. Owners would have forty-five (45) days from receipt of letter to contact the Building Inspector's office and submit a plan for abatement, or Mineral County will pursue legal remedy.

19. Mary Marinello, Mineral County Convention and Tourism Authority – For consideration and possible action relative to Mineral County Convention and Tourism Board appointments.

Mike McNeil present for the Mineral County Convention and Tourism Authority. Letters of interest for the Mineral County Convention and Tourism Board from Barbara Owens and Pamela McMillan were presented for approval by the Board.
